


7th Framework Programme (2007-2013)

- Proposal for Directive on promotion of clean road transport vehicles
 - > public bodies allocate a 25% quota of annual procurement to enhanced environmentally friendly vehicles (EEV)
 - > applies to utility vehicles > 3.5tonnes (eg buses, refuse trucks
- Green Paper on Secure, Competitive and Sustainable Energy for Europe
- CARS21: High Level Group Final Report
 - "A competitive Automotive Regulatory System for the 21st Century;
 - addresses regulatory issues in respect of environment, road safety, trade and competitiveness, R&D, taxation, IPR



EC Support to Fuel Cell and Hydroge RTD in Framework Programmes





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

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EU Joint Technology Initiative – JTI

- ✓ JTI proposal for long term European publicprivate partnership systematically addressing H2 and FC technology challenges.
- Leveraging resources from a variety of sources EU, Member States, Regions, private industry
- JTI will define objectives, manage RTD and Demo programs - to advance from basic research through application, demonstration and validation in real operating conditions
- Support for JTI received from wide range of stakeholders and sectors





EC contributions to the IPHE

- **×** EC-JRC leads Task Force on regulations codes and standards;
- **×** Co-chair Evaluation Team;
- Hosted IPHE workshops on fuel cell testing; bus demonstrations (Porto); hydrogen storage (Lucca); hydrogen safety (Pisa), hydrogen from RES (Seville);
- Four IPHE recognised projects from 1st round, covering hydrogen pathway analysis, safety, distribution, Fuel Cell testing, bus demonstrations;
- 4th Call Energy RTD : negotiating 4 extensions to ongoing RTD project to significantly enhance IPHE dimension (~1.9m€);
- EC submitted 7 new proposals for IPHE recognition on: FC membranes H2 production and storage; low power FC vehicles; extension of bus demonstration; benchmarking





Opportunity for RTD collaboration

- New opportunity for organisations from IPHE partners that are also « targeted third countries » (TTC) to collaborate/contribute to running EC H2&FC contracts – Brazil, China, India, Russia

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Concluding Remarks

- EC committed to IPHE process, welcomes opportunity for deepening collaboration through linking and expanding IPHE recognised projects
- Processes for generating new projects and activities must be facilitated; keep evaluation and monitoring informal and simple
- * Avoid proliferation of groups which strains resources
- IPHE « events » a success, but need to raise awareness of IPHE - emphasising benefits
- SC needs to strengthen its strategic role, ensuring government representation; EC supports priority scorecard process
- SC should explore options for funding specific IPHE actions
- Should be open to new members, maintaining rigorous selection criteria – but need to streamline decision making
- Avoid closed shop explore « other means » Associates, Observers;

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Comment on Discussion Pape « A Strategic Approach »

- SC has key role in strategic decision making, but need streamlined procedures – Executive Committee could help
- × 1 SC meeting a year plus option joint SC/ILC?
- SC must establish itself as the "steering" body, recognising strong interaction with ILC
- IPHE Members *must* be represented in SC by managers representing governments and with budget responsibility
- EC supports priority scorecard process; EC has some suggestions for priorities





Funding of IPHE Activities

- Funding IPHE actions : SC should explore criteria, processes and instruments for funding *specific IPHE collaborative* actions
- General principle: use existing programmes and instruments where possible (i.e. continue with curren project recognition/linking)
- Priority areas for collaboration will be identified at IL meeting at Lyon through Priority Scorecard process; E0 will propose critical objectives and RTD&D actions





IPHE Membership Discussion Pap

- **×** EC welcomes comprehensive paper
- **×** Believes IPHE should be open
- Favours option 3 open to newcomers, but maintain rigorous selection criteria
- * To avoid « closed shop » image, option 3 should be combined with « other means »
- Need to develop further concepts for Associates and Observers, for both SC and ILC
- Executive Committee, could be positive
- IPHE Colloquia TF, yes but should we first resolve roles of SC and ILC



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
